

On 14 April 1995, Alma ČEHAJIĆ, daughter of Muhamed and Munevera née ZUBETLJAK, born 24 April 1976 in Sarajevo where she is also permanently resident at Branke Blažek Street number 1, student, Bosniak, identity established pursuant to LK /identity card/ no. 2720/94 issued by the Novo Sarajevo SJB /Public Security Station/, JMB /Personal Identification Number/ 2404976177658, was summoned to the Sarajevo CSB /Security Services Centre/ and gave the following

#### S T A T E M E N T

On 27 February 1995, I was returning home by tram from the city where I had had to go for healthcare services at the Dental Clinic. The day was calm and I had not heard any shooting at all during the morning. At about 1215 hours, the tram was near the *Maršal Tito* Barracks in Zmaja od Bosne Street, opposite the *Alemko* department store. It was crowded as usual in the tram, but I could not say how many passengers there were. I was standing next to the third door of the tram and was facing the KMT /*Maršal Tito* Barracks/. I heard a burst of automatic weapon fire in the distance, the thud of bullets in the tram and glass breaking. Like all the passengers, I crouched, and felt a blow to my left forearm. The driver did not stop the tram until she had gone round the bend where we were sheltered. She opened the door there, all the passengers left the tram, and people I did not know drove me by car to the Institute for Emergency Medical Services where I was treated and my injury cleaned. I went home from there. The following day, I went to the Sarajevo State Hospital to see a surgeon with a referral from the doctor at the Emergency Medical Services, and he examined my wound, bandaged it and gave me an anti-tetanus injection.

I have nothing further to state on this. My statement has been clearly read out to me, and everything in it is true, which I hereby confirm with my signature.
